[Write us to request a copy.](#) Over 1,100 copies of the first edition HIV nursing curriculum binder were distributed in 47 nations. Train-the-trainer-style educational programs for nurses based on the curriculum have been conducted by BIPAI staff in South Africa, Swaziland, Zimbabwe, Botswana, Namibia, Lesotho, Malawi, Tanzania, Kenya, the Seychelles, Mauritius, Mozambique, Zambia, and for participants from the Democratic Republic of Congo and Angola. These educational programs were held as part of a curriculum implementation plan carried out in collaboration with the SADC AIDS Network of Nurses and Midwives. Hard copies of the curriculum are provided free-of-charge to individuals in developing countries. A fee of \$15 each is charged for copies of the curriculum sent to individuals in the United States and Canada. This \$15 fee is used to offset costs of providing the

curriculum free-of-charge to health professionals in the developing world. This fee can be waived under special circumstances on a case-by-case basis.
